The German Carnivorous Plants Association (Gesellschaft für Fleischfressende Pflanzen im deutschsprachigen Raum e.V. – G.F.P.) welcomes applications for a **young scientist fellowship**.

Grant description:

The G.F.P. is a non-profit NGO. According to its statutes, it promotes knowledge and information about carnivorous plants and their horticulture, assists public institutions such as universities and botanical gardens in their efforts related to carnivorous plants and supports site preservation and conservation projects.

The **young scientist fellowship** is intended to support a young academics on BSc, MSc or PhD level conducting a thesis on carnivorous plants. It covers 3.000 €. There are no limitations on the nature of the research project (laboratory work, field research, conservation etc).

Applicants must be affiliated to a public research institution. The grant is transferred singularly to the institutional account of the applicants host department and must be exclusively used for the applicants research project. Cash payments and transfers to private persons are excluded. Allocation of the grant is subject to the approval of the G.F.P. board assembly.

Application and deadline:

Applications should be prepared according to the preparation guideline and must be submitted by email in PDF format to the president of the G.F.P, Dr. Thomas Gronemeyer (vorsitzender@carnivoren.org). Note that a letter of reference from the supervisor must be included or submitted separately by the supervisor. .

The advisory panel of the G.F.P. will evaluate all incoming applications and promote the most promising projects to the G.F.P. board assembly for final decision. The decision will be based on scientific quality of the applicants research project.

Application deadline is the 1st of May 2020.

Grant utilization:

The grant can be used for all aspects related to the research project. These include lab equipment and consumables, travel expenses, allowances or equipment field research, publication fees etc. Salaries should not be payed by the fellowship.

Project duration:

The grant will be payed singularly. However, the intended duration of the project should be provided.

Prerequisites:

The applicant agrees to provide an illustrated summary article describing the funded research project (in English or German) for the „Taublatt“, the journal of the G.F.P

The applicant is furthermore invited (but not engaged) to present the funded project either on the annual general assembly of the G.F.P or the European Exchange and Exhibition (EEE) conference. The G.F.P. is able to allocate travel funding upon request.

Funding from the G.F.P. should be mentioned in the acknowledgement of any publication resulting from the funded project.
